

Reversible Table Runner

with Ionne McCauley

40" x 14"

Supply List

Batting: use only cotton or cotton/polyester blend batting (such as Hobbs, Perfect Cotton or Warm and Natural) or you may use a fusible cotton batting

- ❖ 3 squares- 10" x 10"
- ❖ 1 square- 14 ¼" x 14 ¼"

Fabrics:

Side A: (blues in sample)

- ❖ fat quarter medium or dark floral print- cut in 14 ¼" square
- ❖ .35 meter lighter floral print- cut 2 squares 10 and 3/8"
- ❖ 5 or 6 assorted coordinating fabrics each cut into three strips in these widths- 1 ½", 1 ¾" and 2 ¼" (these should be at least 15" long)

Sashing: Two 42" strips (or selvedge to selvedge strips) cut **1 ¾" wide.**

Side B: (browns/blacks in sample)

- ❖ fat quarter medium or dark bright print- cut in 14 ¼" square
- ❖ .35 meter lighter hand-dyed or batik type print- cut 2 squares 10 and 3/8"
- ❖ 5 or 6 assorted coordinating fabrics each cut into three strips in these widths- 1 ½", 1 ¾" and 2 ¼" (these should be at least 15" long)

Sashing: Two 42" strips (or selvedge to selvedge strips) cut **1 and 1/8" wide.**

Binding: Three 42" strips (selvedge to selvedge) of a dark print that will suit both sides of your table runner. Cut these strips 2 ½" wide.

Equipment:

- ❖ sewing machine with walking foot, and regular presser feet, including ¼" foot if you have one
- ❖ spare bobbins for your machine
- ❖ **thread to match the large pieces of your chosen fabric (the fat quarters and the .35 meter pieces)**
- ❖ 12 ½" or 15" square ruler, 24" ruler if you have it, rotary cutter (sharp blade, please!), and mat
- ❖ seam ripper, scissors, pins and usual sewing supplies
- ❖ pencil
- ❖ hand sewing needle, and a thimble if you use one
- ❖ masking tape
